Dear President Clinton,

I am deeply concerned about the current paramilitary violence in East Timor and urge your action on this matter. Recent reports have made clear that this violence is funded and encouraged by the Indonesian military and the Indonesian government.

I support suspension of all financial aid, including World Bank funds, until Indonesia curtails paramilitary abuses in East Timor. I also support cessation of all military training and military aid of any kind. These steps are necessary to ensure a free and fair election in East Timor and to support democratization in Indonesia.

As an American Jew, I am outraged to have my country provide ongoing support to a regime that has committed genocide in East Timor (killing 1/3 of the population, including women and children) and which continues to intimidate and kill civilians in East Timor. Paramilitaries have even threatened UN offices in the region. Clearly, a message needs to be given to the Indonesian government and the Indonesian military that this is unacceptable.

I urge your immediate attention to this matter.
