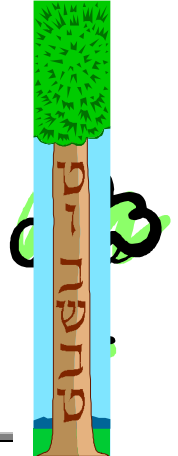
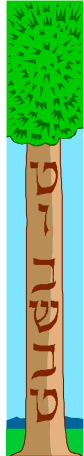

The Tu B'shevat seder is a ritual created by the mystics of Safed, Israel during the 1500's. The seder is divided into four parts, each one corresponding to one of the four worlds of Kabbalah: *Assiyah*, *Yetzirah*, *B'riyah*, and *Atzilut*.

The seder is an opportunity to reconnect our souls with nature in a very spiritual manner and to discuss current environmental concerns, here in the USA and in Israel.
