Lori Berenson is a US citizen being held as a political prisoner in a harsh Peruvian jail high in the Andes. In January, 1996 she was convicted of treason against Perú in a secret military tribunal by a hooded judge. Without a chance for a fair trial, the young reporter was sentenced to life in prison with no possibility of parole. Vigils will be held on that day throughout the country. Join the vigil in your area and tell the U.S. and Peruvian governments that "enough is enough, Lori must come home now."

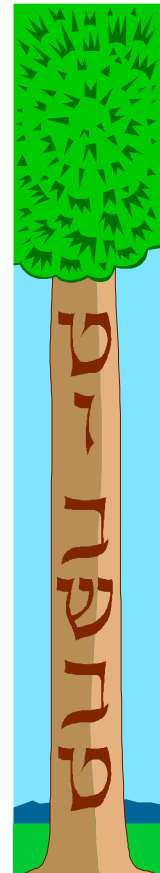
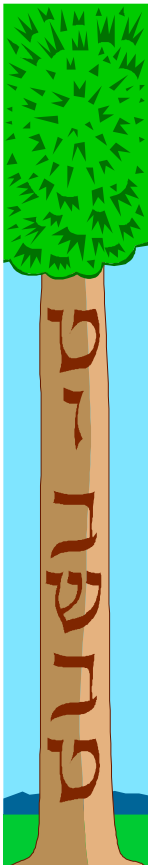

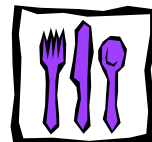
