**D'VAR TEFILLAH**

The Sabbath preceding Pesah is called Shabbat Hagadol. It received the title "great" because of the importance of the forthcoming festival. One of the customs associated with this day is to recite part of the Haggadah: *Avadim hayinu*, "We were slaves" until the words "to atone for all of our sins." One reason given for this is that apparently the redemption began on this day. Another possible reason is to familiarize the children with the contents of the Haggadah, fulfilling the mitzvah of "You shall tell your children on that day." Some Sephardic Jews have the custom when greeting one another on this Shabbat, to say: *Shabbat haGadol mevorach*, "a blessed Shabbat haGadol." What would our religious experiences be like every Shabbat if we greeted each person in this particular way? May all of our Shabbatot be as grand as Shabbat Hagadol!

**FOCUS ON ISRAEL**

As an outgrowth of our mission to make Israel a central focus of BJ and to further the vision of Israel as a modern Jewish, pluralistic democracy, this week we are beginning a new column in the Kol Jeshurun: "Focus on Israel." We hope to present a variety of topics, including speaker profiles, information about our Israeli partnerships, excerpts from and commentary about texts on Israel, and book reviews.

Tishkach Yemini.*

If I forget you, O Jerusalem,  
may my right hand forget its cunning.  
Psalm 137:5

You can acknowledge the centrality of Israel to the Jewish people, which the psalmist so beautifully articulates, by incorporating readings, prayers, and rituals about Israel in your Passover seder. Celebrate Israel by reciting Kiddush over a delicious Israeli wine and acknowledging the miraculous founding of the modern Jewish State. When you break the middle matzah, meant to jar you in the middle of the joyous banquet, think of those in Israel who have lost family and friends in the months since the Israeli-Palestinian negotiations have broken down and violence has escalated. As you share the festive gathering with those you love, imagine the seders with missing loved ones, and pray for peace for the many who have died and have been injured on both sides of the conflict. When you close the seder with *I'shanah habah b'Yerushalaim* – "Next year in Jerusalem," commit to deepen your connection to Israel in the coming year.
