D'VAR TEFILLAH

"And you shall count for yourselves from the morrow of the Shabbat, from the day that you bring the *Omer* [offering] that is raised, seven complete weeks there shall be until the morrow of the seventh week you shall count fifty days" (Leviticus 23:15-16). The counting of the Omer begins from the second night of Passover and leads up to the holiday of Shavuot (celebrating the giving of the Torah), on the fiftieth day. According to the mystics, the 49 days of the Omer symbolize the 49 steps of self-improvement, beginning with the departure from our personal Egypt (*Mitzrayim*, literally the "narrow place"), until our arrival at Mount Sinai, when we are ready to accept the insights of the Torah. According to Rabbi Tzvi Elimelech of Dinov, also known as the B'nai Yissaschar, (1783-1841) states that we should count the Omer with great eagerness from the first day to the last day, until we reach the very day we awaited, the day we received the Torah. The days leading up to the fiftieth day become a part of the celebration of Shavuot. This extended time of preparation is considered to be a period in which we are completely focused on renewing our relationship with God, like a bride we are preparing to embrace our true Love and receive our eternal Ketubah, our marriage contract; which is understood metaphorically as being the Torah.

FOCUS ON ISRAEL

"We remember thee, Zion"

The song when I was learning to drive, decades (no, centuries! millennia!!) ago, was Don McLean's "American Pie." Our high-school Driver Ed teacher was very free with the car radio; I will forever associate that song with learning how to merge onto the Long Island Expressway.

Another song on that album was "By the waters of Babylon," based on the beginning of Psalm 137. The psalm, sung by the Israelites who were driven out of their land about 586 B.C.E. – that exile, which lasted only about 50 years, presaged the later diaspora – begins in mournful, elegiac beauty: "By the rivers of Babylon/there we sat down and wept/when we remembered Zion./We hung our lyres upon the willows in our midst." Babylon, of course, was home to the hanging gardens, one of the wonders of the ancient world; it was legendarily beautiful. The psalm goes on to promise "If I forget thee, Jerusalem, let my right hand forget her cunning" before descending to barbarism ("Happy is he who shall seize and dash thy little ones against the rock!").

McLean sang the first lines in a haunting round; it echoes still in my mind today. He changed the wording slightly – "We remember thee, remember thee, remember thee Zion." It's that "thee" that stays with me. It is the second person singular, but it's familiar. The exiles don't use the more formal "you." We remember "thee," our mother, our home, the place of our earliest memories and truest dreams. And I, too, remember thee, Zion.
