#### FOCUS ON ISRAEL

As an outgrowth of our mission to make Israel a central focus of BJ and to further the vision of Israel as a modern Jewish, pluralistic democracy, we are beginning a new column in the Kol Jeshurun, "Focus on Israel." We hope to present a variety of topics, including speaker profiles, information about our Israeli partnerships, excerpts from and commentary about texts on Israel, and discussions of education, spirituality, and social justice in Israel.

"Voice or exit." That's how some political scientists describe citizens' choices in a democracy. This means you can participate to create change, or give up and exit the system. Too often in Israel, those with low incomes and less education do not participate. Voter turnout is dropping in low-income communities and this "exit" involves no small number of people: as of 2002, based on their earned income, 34% of Israeli families were living in poverty.

Yedid, The Association for Community Empowerment in Israel, was created to assist Israeli families on the geographic and cultural periphery of Israeli society. Yedid works to foster relationships among members of different sectors of the population and to bring disenfranchised communities closer to the principles and practices of democracy. It does so by operating "storefront" community centers in development towns and low-income neighborhoods throughout Israel. These centers not only provide legal assistance in securing government services in employment, housing, health care, education and social security, they train clients to advocate for themselves. In short, Yedid empowers Israelis to use their voice.

Yedid is run by a native New Yorker, Sari Revkin, who made aliyah more than 25 years ago, and who, I can testify, is an exceptional not-for-profit executive. By meeting real social needs while fostering the values of pluralism, peace and equality, Yedid is changing the social and political culture of Israel. Yedid empowers Israelis from marginalized communities to invest in democracy, and in themselves, to create a better country. You can learn more about Yedid at yedid.org.il.
