## Bipolar Nationality

Every year this week is a challenging one on the Israeli calendar.

As a child growing up in Israel, I knew nothing about Bipolar Personality, a condition causing a person to bounce rapidly between depression and mania. Yet I often had difficulty handling the week between Yom Hashoah (Holocaust Remembrance Day) and Yom Ha'atzmaut (Independence Day). The sharp-curved, emotional rollercoaster ride took me from death-and-destruction stories to the elation of the declaration of Israel's independence, from the abyss of despair to the summit of joy. The explanation for the jarring proximity of dates was that out of the ashes of the former emerged the redemption of the latter. Yet for us kids, it was still difficult to let the images of Israeli soldiers marching proudly erase the images of European Jews on their march to death. Even as kids we sensed there was something unnatural in this quick passage.

As an adult (not a psychologist, mind you!), I accept that one must be cautious not to apply to a nation the same Psychological Diagnostic Reference lingo used on a person. But—what if a nation could be diagnosed, too, with Bipolar Personality? I would call it "Bipolar Nationality," rather than Personality, yet could it offer an explanation for our infamous national mood swings? How one day we see ourselves as a global super power and the other, as a child at risk? Or how we swell one day with pride to win a Nobel Prize and mourn the collapse of our schools the next? Drama rules our daily life; we cycle between euphoria and panic, hope and fear, reality and hallucination.

No wonder it is hard for our nation to make sound and sane decisions: both mania and depression tend to cloud one's vision of the world and propel one toward impulsive steps. Volumes have been written trying to explain "the Israelis," but it is hard to know who we are if we shuttle between such extreme self-images. The late Israeli Premier, Levi Eshkol, was once asked how Israel should present itself to Washington: as a weak nation, that needs American help or as one strong as Samson that is worthy of American partnership? "Present us as Samson, the Weak," advised the wise Premier, tongue-in-cheek. Indeed, it seems that this duality, or ambivalence or—as I just coined here—Bipolar Nationality, has become a striking component of our Israeli national character.

Happy 61st Anniversary, Israel! May you have a safe, sane and self-assured existence!
