Dear BJ Community,

At this difficult time when Israel is under rocket attack, we stand in solidarity with the people of Israel and support Israel's right to defend itself. We pray for the safety and well-being of Israel's citizens, as well as for the safety of Gaza's innocent civilians caught in the conflict. It is our fervent hope that the hostilities will promptly cease and that significant efforts will be made towards peace and security.

We have been in contact with our friends and partners in Israel at HaMidrasha, Nigun HaLev, Beit Tefila Israeli and others and have expressed our concern and support.

We will be including Psalm 121 (Shir Lama'alot Esa Einai) at all BJ prayer services as an expression of our hope for protection and peace.

We invite all BJ members to consider a partial or total fast on the 17th of Tammuz (Tuesday, July 15), a traditional fast day in mourning for the breach of Jerusalem's walls which led three weeks later to the destruction of Jerusalem. After the horrible murders of Eyal Yifrach, Naftali Frenkel, Gilad Shaar and Mohammed Abu Khdeir and the cycle of hatred, revenge and violence, we keenly feel the fragility of Jerusalem and Israel, and believe that our fast can express our concern, our solidarity and our plea for a brighter future.
